They deserve a chance to play. That's one of the things I firmly believe in. Now how that gets adjudicated, I don't know. That's beyond my pay grade. I see, I see what Laura's talking about. I mean, these kids deserve a chance and there are some situations where you are. I mean, I'm really close with Bruce Jenner, Caitlyn Jenner, and I mean, we've been friends for a long time. And you know, they won't let him play in the, in the women's championships at Sherwood Country Club. He plays against the men and he kicks their ass, too. So, I mean, I gotta be honest with you, I wonder, you know? And I guess it all came down to the one girl in volleyball, who the one athlete hit her, hit her with the volleyball and then she's got big problems now. I think that might've overdramatized, overmagnified the situation a little, but you know,

It's a tough, tough situation. But you know, I, I've, I've,
