Let me just say this before we go to break. Baseball is not football, in my mind, from the perspective, you know, the fans in a football game can be loud. You can't hear the signals if you're a quarterback. I don't think the Dodgers are looking up and saying, Oh, 80% of Canada is, you know, favoring Toronto, and 50% are watching it on TV.
